Brief Summary of Activities

In 2026, the AWP will build on the established foundation set by the 2025 AWP, emphasizing progress and continuity. It will focus on fortifying Health Systems, ensuring alignment with national policies and guidelines, enhancing Information Health Management Systems, and promoting sustainable financing mechanisms. Key initiatives will include capacity-building for healthcare providers, upgrading health facilities to improve service delivery, procuring and distributing essential commodities, and advocacy efforts to shift social norms and foster behavioral change to enhance access to Reproductive and Adolescent Health and gender-responsive services. The roadmap for harnessing the demographic dividend remains a critical strategic component. The strategy of engaging local Youth-Led and Women-Led organizations is designed to foster trust and confidence by demonstrating a cohesive approach among stakeholders. These activities are intentionally aligned with the three transformative results of the UNFPA, the EU SARAH result framework, the SWaP Initiative, and the current priorities of the Adamawa State Government, ensuring a unified strategic effort.
