

ADAMAWA STATE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (ADSEMA), YOLA

Key Achievements: 2023 – August 2025

1. Relief Assistance to Insurgency Victims (2023)

In response to an insurgent attack in Dabna community (Hong LGA) on May 30th 2023 ADSEMA provided ₦1.6 million in cash and essential relief items—including rice, maize, cement, zinc, nails, mats, salt, seasoning cubes, soap, and buckets—to affected families.

ADSEMA/NEMA embarked on Special National Economic Livelihood Emergency Intervention (SNELEI), about 21,000 flood affected people Benefited from the intervention on 1st June 2023 across the 21 LGAs.

2. Monthly Humanitarian Coordination (February 2024)

ADSEMA hosted the Monthly State Humanitarian Co-ordination Meeting in February 2024 at ADSUBEB conference hall. The event brought together NEMA, government ministries, agencies, and development partners to strengthen collaboration and emphasize disaster risk reduction strategies.

3. Windstorm Relief in Mayo-Belwa LGA (August 2024)

Following a windstorm disaster, NEMA and ADSEMA distributed relief supplies—including rice, maize, vegetable oil, seasoning cubes, and more—to affected communities in Mayo-Belwa LGA on August 16, 2024.

4. Comprehensive Flood Impact Assessment (Late 2024)

Between October 28 and November 8, 2024, a joint assessment by ADSEMA, IOM-DTM, NEMA, and the Red Cross identified 361,919 individuals in 66,360 households affected by flooding in Adamawa State, including 68,576 internally displaced persons (IDPs) in 11,376 households across 16 LGAs.

5. iMMAP Technical Review Workshop (October 2024)

A workshop by iMMAP Inc., aimed at boosting information management and capacity for humanitarian response, was held on October 11, 2024. ADSEMA, along with state government representatives and humanitarian partners, participated in the event.

Achievements & Initiatives in 2025 (So Far)

6. on 20th February 2025 7 IDPs were detained at prison as a result of internal conflict among them ADSEMA intervened through chief Registrar Office (CR) they were released and referred to ADSEMA and resolve to a peaceful cohesion

On January, 2025 ADSEMA prepositioned package of food items in anticipation of flood response across the State.

ADSEMA in collaboration with UNDP on yearly basis distributed both dry and rainy season farming inputs to farmers in Madagali LGA.

ADSEMA in collaboration with UNDP on yearly basis trained youth on Skills Acquisition on various trade e.g. Tailoring, Plumbing, knitting etc. and giving them a starter pack.

2025 Flood Risk Sensitization Campaign

In May 2025, ADSEMA in collaboration with NEMA launched a statewide sensitization campaign focused on flood preparedness and response particularly for communities along the River Benue and Gongola. The initiative involved traditional leaders, youth, and women's groups and emphasized early warning systems, evacuation readiness, and community ownership in mitigating flood risks.

ADSEMA in collaboration with MCRP distributed life jackets, life buoys, rain boots, rain coat and touch light across flood prone communities of Fufore, Yolla-North, Yola-South, Girei, Demsa, Lamurde and Numan LGAs in the month of April, 2025.

ADSEMA responded to a communal clash between Bachama and Tsobo of Lamurde LGA with food and non-food items at Waduku, Tsobo and Rigange communities. 22nd July, 2025.

ADSEMA in collaboration with other partners embarked on simulation exercise at flood prone communities of Numan, Lamurde and Demsa on 19th June, 2025.

ADSEMA embarked on search and rescue on 27th July, 2025 following the Flash flood that occurred in Yola south that led to displacement of 587 household from various communities of Bole Yolde-Pate and Makama B ward, 2 camps were established at

Adamu Abubakar Namtari Primary School and Aliyu Musdapha College which was collapsed to Aliyu Musdapha College with the number 600 households after the situation was relatively calm IDPs voluntarily returned to their homes were food and NFIs including N50,000 Cash assistance provided to 600 Households equivalent 3,522 individuals.

Similarly, on 9th August 2025 ADSEMA supported the 7 affected communities with Food and NFIs where 4,000 Households benefited from the intervention, items distributed include Rice, Maize, Spaghetti, Vegetable oil, Mat, Blanket, Children's wear, Shadda, Wrappers, Seasoning cube and Salt.

Also, on 21st August 2025 ADSEMA provided relief materials to 15 Flood affected Local Government Areas items include Rice, Maize, Spaghetti, Nylon mat, Blanket, Wax Print, Shadda.

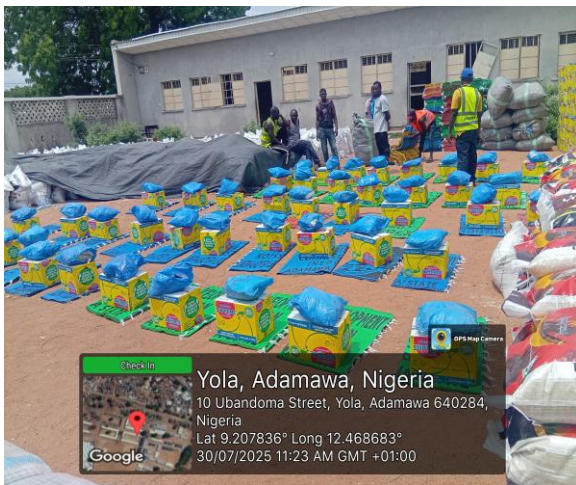
- Strengthening of Community Emergency Management Committees across the 21 LGAs
